<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Role</b></p> <p>You may take on the role of yourself or another person, or you may take on the role of something inanimate—something that doesn't have life-like qualities.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Format</b></p> <p>Experiment with a variety of formats such as telegrams, wanted posters, letters, diary entries, obituaries, epitaphs, and brochures. Explore the possibilities. Don't restrict yourself to one format!</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Audience</b></p> <p>The audience you are writing for can vary tremendously. Variation in audience requires a variation in the format and level of language you use!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Topic</b></p> <p>Topics need to relate to the role and audience selected. Make sure your topic fits who you are trying to be as well as your audience.</p>
